Illinois Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White invites students in grades 4-12 to enter Letters About Literature, a statewide writing competition offered by the Illinois State Library's Illinois Center for the Book.

### COMPETITION LEVELS

Level 1: Grades 4-6

Level 2: Grades 7-8

Level 3: Grades 9-12



## HOW TO ENTER

- READ.** Select a book to read that sounds interesting to you. It might be a book to help you through a difficult time or one that simply touches your heart or inspires you.
- REFLECT.** Think before you write. How did this author's book change you or your view of the world? How do you know it did? How and why are you different now than you were before you read this book?
- WRITE.** Your entry should be written in letter format. It should include a date, greeting, body, closing, and your name or signature.
  - PERSUADE.** Write a personal letter to the author, stating how reading his or her book changed you. Be personal but also persuasive.
  - SUPPORT.** This is not a fan letter, but rather a reflection on how the author influenced you. Include your thoughts and ideas with specific details, including supportive details from the book itself. Write honestly, from your own perspective.
  - SHARE.** Imagine sitting down with the author of this book and sharing your personal thoughts and reaction to the book.
- ENTRY FORM.** Your letter **MUST** be accompanied by a completed entry form. This information is used to contact winners, so be sure the entry form is complete and legible. Letters without an entry form will be disqualified.
- MAIL.** Staple the required entry form to the front of your letter. Write your competition level on the outside of your envelope. Mail your entry via the USPS by the postmark deadline to:

- EMAIL.** Send your letter with the subject line: **LAL, competition level** (Indicate level 1, 2 or 3), **school name** and **city**. Also include an attached copy of the required entry form by the postmark deadline to: [islcomps@ilsos.gov](mailto:islcomps@ilsos.gov).

### TEACHERS NOTES:

- EACH LETTER MUST** be accompanied by an entry form. Letters without an entry form will be disqualified.
- TO SAVE TIME** completing entry forms for your class, complete the static information on one entry form. Make copies of that form and pass those copies out to your students to complete their personal information.
- Mail class sets in a flat envelope – 8 x 10 or larger.
- Use separate envelopes for different competition levels – Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3.
